FINANCIAL SERVICES

The formal **financial services sector** consists of all those companies, institutions and intermediaries that are legally registered to provide the general public with financial services aimed at lending them money, taking deposits and funds for investment from them (i.e. for savings purposes), helping them make or receive payments (the banks) and insuring them against risk.

These service providers include:

- banks
- insurance companies
- providers of financial advice and intermediary services
- the JSE Securities Exchange
- microlenders
- stockbrokers
- unit trusts management companies
- Linked Investment Services Providers (LISPs)
- Bond Exchange of South Africa
- Pension funds

The **financial services sector** also includes those **organisations that control or supervise the service providers themselves**. As pointed out, the regulatory bodies for financial services are the **Registrar of Banks**, the **Financial Services Board**, the **Micro Finance Regulatory Council**, the **Registrar of Usuary** and the **Consumer Affairs Committee**.

Every South African should know about these service providers and supervisory organisations.
